# About

The purpose of the group Narrative Research Lab is the investigation of narrative in various media and art forms; its forms, techniques and voices, its cross medial potential and its relations to different cultural discourses. The issues of narrative are addressed from a variety of positions and perspectives, focusing on topics like unreliable narration, ideology and politics, intermediality, remediation, realism, irony, autofiction and autobiography and other non-fictional narratives like testimonies. Two positions with international impact, which are closely associated with NRL are "Unnatural Narratology" and rhetorical fictionality theory including the Aarhus University based Centre for Fictionality Studies.


