We engage in international research collaboration and organise research events on both theoretical and societally topical issues. We foster dialogue between researchers, artists and others outside academia.

Narrative agency, master and counter-narratives, the ethics of storytelling, life-storying, life-writing, creative writing, cultural and transcultural memory, limits and affordances of cultural narratives, oral history, archives and digital storytelling war, violence and cultural trauma, illness narratives, environmental narratives, reading groups and bibliotherapy, intersectionalism and activism...
