# A1 LEVEL COURSE

This course "FLE Level A1", offered by the Université Paris Cité, is intended for A1 level students from all disciplines. This course focuses on oral and written comprehension and expression, on the acquisition of grammatical points and vocabulary corresponding to speech acts allowing communication in everyday life

### A2 LEVEL COURSE

This course "FLE Level A2 ", offered by the Université Paris Cité, is intended for students of level A2 from all disciplines. This course focuses on oral and written comprehension and expression, on the acquisition of grammatical points and vocabulary corresponding to speech acts allowing communication in everyday life.

LEVEL: A2

### **PROGRAM**:

According to the students' knowledge, the following communicative objectives will be worked on:

- Introduce oneself and someone else (masculine, feminine, plural of nouns; adjectives; present tense; questioning)
- Asking for and giving information (numbers, dates, official time; questioning)
- Talking about oneself, one's activities, one's tastes (adverbs of intensity; adjectives of intensity)
- Describe a person (adjectives; possessive adjectives)
- Locate oneself in a space; ask, indicate a direction (adverbs and prepositions of place; imperative)
- Shopping, ordering at a restaurant (partitives and negation, use of conditional to express wishes *Je voudrais*)
- Buy a gift, a piece of clothing (COD, COI, demonstrative adjectives)
- Compare (comparative, superlative)
- Give your opinion (present conditional)
- Talk about plans (near future, simple future)
- Tell a past event (past composed, imperfect tense, some time indicators).

NUMBER OF HOURS: 11 sessions of 2 hours each, i.e. 22 hours of class per semester.

### ASSESSMENT:

A midterm test + a final test (see details of the calculation of the final grade in the general information sheet given to students at the beginning of the first course).

No retake exam is possible.



### **GRAMMAR B1**

The grammar course, offered by the Université Paris Cité, is intended for students at the B1 level. It focuses on grammatical points spread over the two semesters (see program below). After an explanation of each grammatical point in class, students are offered exercises to enable them to become familiar with the functioning of the grammatical tool studied, both in sentences and in texts.

CODE: ELLIY 420 (S1) ELLPY 430 (S2)

LEVEL: B1

### PROGRAM:

#### Semester 1

- Past tenses: conjugations and uses (imperfect tense, compound past tense, plus-perfect tense, " venir de ", recognition of the forms of the simple past tense).
- Personal pronouns and verbal constructions: forms, uses (place and usefulness in the anaphoric chain in speech).
- The conditional (polite request, proposal, expression of a desire, advice, future in the past).

### Semester 2

- Negation: the most common forms.
- Simple relative pronouns: « qui, que quoi, où, dont »
- The expression of the hypothesis: « Si »+PRES and « Si » + IMP (forms and uses).
- Introduction to the present subjunctive. Forms of the verbs groups 1 and 2 + aller, venir, pouvoir, savoir, être, avoir. Use: expression of an order (*il faut que, je veux que*), of a goal (pour que, afin que), of a wish (*je souhaite que*).

The grammar course, offered by the Université Paris Cité, is intended for students at the B2 level. It is centered on grammatical points seen on the two semesters (see program below). After an explanation of each grammatical point in class, students are offered exercises to enable them to become familiar with the functioning of the grammatical tool studied, both in sentences and in texts.

LEVEL: B2

#### **PROGRAM**:

Semester 1

- Past tenses: conjugations and uses (imperfect tense, compound past tense, simple past tense, past perfect tense, future and conditional tenses)

- Rules of agreement of the past participle (all cases)

- Personal pronouns (including difficult cases)

- Negation (including difficult cases)

### Semester 2

- The relative subordinate clause (all cases)

- The subordinate clause (indirect speech and use of the subjunctive)

More specifically, it aims at correcting pronunciation by raising awareness of the characteristics of oral French.

### ORAL WORKSHOP: PRONUNCIATION and SONG (B2/C1)

This "Oral: pronunciation and song" workshop, offered by Université Paris Cité, is intended for B2/C1 level students from all disciplines. The aim of this course is to help students acquire natural, intelligible pronunciation and intonation, use the resources of prosody to communicate with pleasure in spoken French, give a presentation and interpret a text or song.

### ORAL WORKSHOP (C1)

The objective of this course is to help students master the registers in everyday exchanges as well as argumentation in formal situations (professional interviews, meetings, conferences, etc.). They are invited to communicate on complex subjects, with a high degree of grammatical correctness, through role-playing, presentations and debates.

### CULTURE & CIVILIZATION WORKSHOP (B1/B2)

This "Culture & Civilization" workshop, offered by the Université Paris Cité, is intended for B1/B2 level students from all disciplines. The objective of this course is to provide students with the tools to better understand the different aspects of the French culture.

This workshop is based on the discovery, in an intercultural approach, of some major subjects that reveal and shape the beliefs and values of the French people.

It will also allow students to work on lexical fields through the study of authentic documents (reports, interviews, film excerpts, drawings, songs, etc.).

Depending on the possibilities, this course will also provide an opportunity for outdoor activities, alone or in groups, in close connection with the course's pedagogical content: visits to museums or neighborhoods, exhibitions, cinema, etc.

- The great periods of French history
- The symbols of the Republic
- Political institutions
- Multicultural France

- Architecture
- Painting
- Fashion and cinema
- Gastronomy etc.

### CINEMA WORKSHOP (B2/C1)

France is known for its privileged relationship with cinema, which is considered the "seventh art". The worldwide fame of the Cannes Film Festival and the New Wave (Truffaut, Chabrol, Godard) proves the cultural importance of cinema for this country.

This film workshop, offered by the Université Paris Cité and intended for B2/C1 level students from all disciplines, is a language course that also aims to introduce students to film analysis so that they can speak accurately about the films they have seen while understanding certain aspects of French culture, particularly the relationship between men and women.

### WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES:

Through the analysis of sequences from several films (1 sequence per week), this instruction aims at cultural and linguistic objectives:

1. Get to know how to talk about cinema: the shot, the angle, the camera movements...

2. Through excerpts, discover films by past and present authors: Méliès, Renoir, Truffaut, Godard, Varda, Mouret, Audiard...

3. To know how to describe a character physically but also psychologically in order to understand his behavior, to describe a place, a landscape, to analyze the details, the implicit, the ambiguity and the style of the films.

4. Intensive training of language skills on film documents (oral comprehension and expression, rephrasing, writing dialogues).

5. To produce a short film (8 minutes) in group.

NUMBER OF HOURS: 11 sessions of 2 hours each, i.e. 22 hours of class per semester.

**ASSESSMENT:** 1 midterm test + 1 exam (see details of the calculation of the final grade in the general information sheet given to students at the beginning of the first course). No retake exam is possible.



### ARGUMENTATIVE TEXTS WORKSHOP (C1)

This workshop on "Argumentative Texts", offered by the Université Paris Cité, is intended for C1 level students from all disciplines. The objective of this course is to develop students' ability to analyze and produce argumentative texts for academic purposes.
